Dear Mr. Liebengood:

On February 20, I wrote to you requesting that you authorize access to your papers at the Library of Congress relating to your work for the Senate Select Committee to Study Governmental Operations with Respect to Intelligence Activities ("Church Committee"), including material on President Kennedy's assassination. Since then, we have called you several times regarding this matter. You have not responded to our letter or any of our several phone calls. We checked with the Library on May 6, and they advised us that they have not received any authorization from you regarding access to your papers.

I am writing again to request your assistance in opening up any papers that may be relevant to the Kennedy assassination. The JFK Assassination Records Collection Act specifically references Church Committee materials as ones that should be opened up to the public. I would appreciate your earliest attention to this matter. Please call me or my associate, Ronald G. Haron, so that we can resolve this matter.
