Thank you for your July 29, 1997 letter regarding the submission of Treasury's Final Declaration of Compliance. As we discussed, the Department of Treasury may submit its Final Declaration of Compliance by September 19, 1997.

In addition to the record categories that we have asked the Department of Treasury to review, we hereby request that you locate the 1963-64 files for Arnold Sagalyn, Director for Law Enforcement Coordination at the Department of Treasury. Mr. Sagalyn's responsibilities appear to have involved the Secret Service, and we believe his files should be reviewed for assassination-related materials.

We would also like to be certain that any Treasury files relating to communications or work with either the Church Committee (1975-76) or the House Select Committee on Assassinations ("HSCA") (1977-78) have been identified and located. While Treasury has identified and designated as assassination records files of Special Assistant Robert McBrien relating to Treasury's work on Church Committee and HSCA matters, please also determine whether there are any distinct Treasury General Counsel files relating to these Committees.
