Dear Mr. Good:

Thank you for speaking with me by phone on January 24 to discuss some preliminary questions I had with respect to Presidential records, including issues regarding the disposition of records maintained by the Kennedy and Johnson administrations. Steve Tilley, Chief of the JFK Assassination Records Collection at the National Archives, had recommended that I contact you.

As I explained to you, the Review Board is attempting to identify major groups of records from the Kennedy and Johnson administrations that may contain materials related to the assassination of President Kennedy or to the subsequent investigation by the Warren Commission. We are currently working with the Lyndon B. Johnson and John F. Kennedy Presidential Libraries, as well as the National Archives and the Library of Congress, to identify and process, under the JFK Assassination Records Collection Act, any such records they may have. However, I had inquired of you whether there are other 1963-64 White House records that are in Government storage, but not within the custody of the Presidential Libraries, the National Archives, or the Library of Congress. You were not certain.

I am writing to solicit your assistance in determining whether any archival records from either the Kennedy or Johnson White House may still reside in Government storage outside the custody of those Federal Government entities with whom we are working. In particular, we are interested in locating 1962-64 records for the President's Foreign Intelligence Advisory Board, the Office of the White House Physician, and the White House Communications Agency. Please let us know what

information you can obtain regarding the existence and location of these records. Thank you for your assistance.
