Dear Mr. Newt:

I am attaching three (3) House Select Committee on Assassinations records that have been referred to the Department of Justice by the National Archives and Record Administration (NARA) under the JFK Act.

These records differ from the ones I forwarded in my letter of March 19th in that we have found no duplicates of these records already open in other parts of the JFK Collection.

Of the three attached documents, two are unclassified. One of the documents (HSCA Record 180-10110-10073) was classified SECRET in 1978. Our initial examination did not reveal any reason to believe this latter record should be classified in 1996.

As part of its responsibilities under the JFK Act, the Review Board is now reviewing records compiled by the HSCA to determine to what extent they may be made available to the public. Our Board intends to make determinations regarding the attached documents at its meeting of April 16-17, 1996. Should DoJ have any objection to the release of these records, or parts thereof, the Department should inform the Board of its objections -- with specificity -- by April 9, 1996. Any objections should reference the NARA Record Number shown at the top of the Record Information Form attached to each document. Our Board will consider any evidence DoJ wishes to submit in

support of such objections.
