Dear Gary:

I am writing in response to your September 18, 1996 letter regarding possible interviews of Parkland personnel by the Secret Service and the FBI.

I reviewed the footnote you cite from Josiah Thompson's book (footnote 14 on page 215 of *Six Seconds in Dallas*). The footnote suggests that he did not know whether such reports exist. He thereupon refers to the published Warren Commission testimony of some witnesses (pages 1-152 of volume VI). These pages, of course, contain the testimony of 28 different Parkland employees who were deposed by the Warren Commission.

The only individual agent report (relating to interviews by the Secret Service or FBI of Dallas medical personnel) of which I am aware is the written report of USSS Special Agent Elmer Moore, prepared on 12/12/63, which documents his 12/11/63 interviews of 10 different Parkland personnel. (I have enclosed a copy with this letter.)

We have, of course, requested that agencies provide us with records that would include post-assassination interviews of the type you suggest. I am not now aware of any additional reports. If you are aware of any documentation that would identify other agents who conducted interviews, and the dates of such interviews, I would very much appreciate receiving the specifics of these leads so that we can go to the agencies involved with documented requests for specific records.
