I am writing to thank you once again for the interview I conducted with you on October 26, 1996. As we discussed, there has been a substantial amount of interest in your role as a member of the 112th Intelligence Corps Group's Dallas Office at the time of the assassination of President Kennedy. I think your interview will assist both current researchers and future historians to better understand this tragic episode in American history.
