By letter dated October 26, 1995, the ARRB made certain requests of the Civil Rights Division for additional information and records regarding the Division's search for and disposition of records related to the assassination of President Kennedy. A copy of this letter is enclosed.

To date, we have received none of the requested information nor any other response. As elaborated in our October 26, 1995 letter, our statutory authority to make these requests is beyond question, as is the Civil Rights Division's obligation to comply with them. *See, e.g.*, 44 U.S.C. § 2107.10(b)(3) ("all Executive agencies should cooperate in full with the Review Board to seek the disclosure of all information relevant to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy consistent with the public interest"). Accordingly, I reiterate the requests set out in the October 26, 1995 letter, and ask that you respond to them as soon as reasonably possible.
