I would like to thank you very much for the courtesy that you extended to Jeremy Gunn of my staff on his trip to Parkland Hospital. The Assassination Records Review Board has received excellent cooperations from many persons and institutions in its effort to collect records related to the assassination of President Kennedy.

Following up on your discussion with Mr. Gunn, we would like to request formally that Parkland Hospital donate its original records related to the assassination to the American people to be included in the JFK Collection at the National Archives. We would be particularly interested in receiving your records related to the treatment of President Kennedy, Governor Connally, Lee Harvey Oswald, and Jack Ruby. (We are not requesting any medical records related to Marina Oswald (Porter)).

If Parkland is agreeable to donating these records, I would ask that you have your General Counsel contact Mr. Gunn, who will arrange to send a draft deed of gift to you. We anticipate that the National Archives will send a representative (presumably from Fort Worth) to arrange for shipment of the materials.
