I would like to thank you and Mr. Miller for coming to our offices last week and discussing with us issues related to the assassination of President Kennedy. As promised, I am enclosing a copy of the audio taped interview (two cassettes) and our memorandum memorializing the interview (without attachments).

We would now like to request that Mr. Miller donate to the National Archives the originals of three sets of documents: *first*, the handwritten notes that he made in conjunction with his official trip to Dallas in the days following the assassination (Bates nos. HJM 0053-0056); *second*, the typed notes describing his activities after the assassination (Bates nos. HJM 0001-0014); and *third*, the letters included in the file labeled CI-4 (Joe McConnon) and which appear to be signed by "José" (Bates nos. HJM 1194-1242). We believe that these records, which appear to have been created or collected in conjunction with official business of the U.S. government, would be valued additions to the JFK Collection at the National Archives. We would be happy to work with you to transfer the records to the Archives.

We will be in touch with you in the future regarding Mr. Miller's knowledge of issues related to the assassination that developed after he left the Department of Justice.
