Re: Assassination Records in Requested FBI Files

Dear Carol:

The ARRB staff has completed its review of a number of files that you provided to us at our request. These files, and our staff assessment of the extent to which they contain assassination records, are identified on the enclosed list.¹ If you have questions about any of the staff recommendations, members of our FBI team will be happy to discuss them with you.

If you agree with our staff recommendations that the records identified on the list should be processed as assassination records under the JFK Act, please so advise. If there are any recommendations with which you disagree, please identify the documents in question, so that the Review Board can decide whether to designate them as assassination records. If this step proves necessary, we hope to present such documents to the Review Board at the meeting scheduled for April 23-24, 1997.

In some instances, we believe that there may be additional records responsive to particular requests that we have not yet reviewed. These instances are identified on the attached list. We request that you make any such records available as well.

¹In our view, some of the records we have recommended for processing under the JFK Act might contain information that could be regarded as “not believed relevant” to the assassination (*e.g.*, a record summarizing the contents of an entire file).
