Dear Mr. Matthews:

In accordance with the President John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection Act of 1992, I am writing to inform you that the Assassination Records Review Board has made additional formal determinations concerning the public disclosure of Army records at its meeting on November 17, 1997. Records from the Califano papers are listed on page 35 and begin with the prefix "198."

Enclosed is a list of the determinations that the Review Board has made. These decisions were based on several factors including the historical interest in the documents and the absence of evidence that the release of the information would cause harm to the United States or to any individual.

All postponements requested by your agency were upheld by the Board. However, should you disagree with the Board's decisions, you have seven days to appeal these decisions to the President. You are invited to send your representative to the Review Board's offices to examine our copies of the documents for which determinations have been made and to discuss the determinations with the Review Board staff.
