Re: Request for Additional Records and Information No. NSA-2 from the <u>Assassination Records</u> Review Board

## Dear Claudia:

We will be sending to you, from time-to-time, requests for additional information and records to facilitate the completion of the Review Board's task of compiling the most complete record possible of the assassination of President Kennedy. Under our Act, we are empowered to request additional records and information from government agencies to assist us in this process. *See* 44 U.S.C. § 2107.7(j)(1)(C)(ii). *See also* 36 C.F.R. 1400.2, 60 FR 33345, 33349 (June 28, 1995). We will be numbering our requests from this point forward as "NSA-2," "NSA-3," etc., in order to help track our requests and your responses to them. (We consider our March 9, 1995 request to be NSA-1.) This letter thus constitutes our second request.

We request that NSA collect all of its files, records, reports, or any other information, pertaining to the monitoring, intercepting, or any other type of data collection between the years 1960 and 1965 inclusive (unless otherwise noted) regarding the following:

*First,* Cuban groups (including diplomats, emigres, political activists, and others) or individuals in the United States;

Second, any assassination attempts against Fidel Castro or any other high Cuban official;

Third, any organized crime activities related to Cuba between 1958 and 1970;

Fourth, any military or paramilitary plans and/or operations, whether based in the United States or elsewhere, that were targeted at Cuba; and

Fifth, any other groups that engaged in anti-Castro activities.

We ask that this request be interpreted as *broadly* as possible in order that we may understand the complete range of records possessed by NSA on these subjects. If any of these requests becomes unduly burdensome, we ask that you consult with us in order to consider how the scope of the search reasonably could be narrowed.

We appreciate your help in this matter.
