Ms. Tammi Long, of my staff, has been in contact with Sheila Allen of the Human Resources Division and Betty Ball of the Postal Inspector Service. I would like to thank both individuals for their initial assistance with our review of documents that have been identified as assassination records by the Postal Service. Mrs. Ball has been especially helpful in searching for any records that may exist in the Postal Inspector Field Offices, particularly Dallas, Texas.

We have now reviewed both the records at the Postal Service Headquarters, and the accession files at the Federal Records Center at Suitland. Ms. Long has identified several record series that may contain assassination records that are subject to the JFK Assassination Records Collection Act. Members of our staff would like to review these records in order to make a complete assessment of the items which belong in the assassination records collection.

We hope to be able to determine the current state of U.S. Postal Service records in the Federal Records Center -- including organizational scheme and the range of dates of the records. We would like to visit the Federal Records Center within the next month, and thus ask that you let us know which dates would be convenient for a member of your staff to attend with us.
