Thank you for your letter of December 4, 1996 in which you point out an important omission from our last Federal Register notice.

During its meeting on November 13-14, 1996, the Review Board voted to release the two protective surveys [154-10002-10422 and 154-10002-10423] in full. The Review Board's determinations concerning these records was inadvertently omitted from the Federal Register Notice of December 2, 1996, as well as our formal notification to Director Bowron on December 2, 1996.

Your letter acknowledges my letter to you of October 21, 1996, in which I pointed out that the information you seek to postpone in the two protective surveys has already been released to the public. It is not entirely clear from your letter whether the fact of the prior release has in any way affected your decision to pursue the postponements. Please keep in mind that given the Board's recent determinations, the Secret Service would need to appeal to the President should you continue to seek postponement of this information.
