Dear Mr. Assistant Attorney General:

The Assassination Records Review Board requests that the Department of Justice issue a subpoena duces tecum to Mr. Harry Connick. Mr. Connick is the District Attorney of New Orleans Parish, Louisiana.

On June 28, 1995, at the Review Board's public hearing in New Orleans, Mr. Connick promised to give to the Review Board all materials relating to former New Orleans District Attorney Jim Garrison's investigation and prosecution of Clay Shaw, with the exception of any grand jury materials.¹

Shortly thereafter, a private party mailed to the Review Board documents that appear to be grand jury materials that the private party reportedly had obtained many years ago from the District Attorney's office. Mr. Connick requested that the Review Board return the grand jury materials to his office and has issued a subpoena to the Review Board demanding return of the materials. The Review Board is working with the Federal Programs Branch of the Department of Justice to resolve the issues that have arisen concerning the grand jury materials. ² Unfortunately, and presumably as a result of

this dispute, Mr. Connick has failed to deliver to the Board the assassination records that he promised to produce in June.

Thus, the Review Board would like for the subpoena to require Mr. Connick to produce those materials that he promised to the Review Board at its June 28, 1995, public hearing in New Orleans.
