Re: Additional Information Requests

Dear Mr. Vezeris:

This letter constitutes our twenty-first request for additional information and records under the President John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection Act of 1992, 44 U.S.C. § 2107 (Supp. V. 1994). In view of the fact that the Review Board's mandate will expire on September 30, 1998, we anticipate that this will be our final, formal request for additional information.

A. CO2-33115 ("Cuban/Anti-Cuban Activities")

In response to the Review Board's request (SS-17) for all documents contained in file number CO-2-33,115 (a numerical prefix for approximately 157 separate files maintained on individuals involved in Cuban/anti-Cuban activities), the Secret Service provided us with computer abstracts on 150 individuals. *See* April 18, 1997 letter from Jane Vezeris to David Marwell. Upon reviewing these abstracts, we have determined that we would like to request the raw files (provided they still exist), of the individuals listed in Attachment A of this letter.

B. <u>Files from Secret Service Inventories</u>

During a July 31, 1997 compliance meeting, the Secret Service provided Review Board staff members Joan Zimmerman and Ronald Haron with the following inventories of Secret Service records in archives: (1) Inventory OPO 85-0001, entitled, "Protection (Historical); (2) Inventory PPD 85-0001; (3) Inventory MNO 85-0008; (4) Inventory MNO 85-0011; and (5) Inventory MNO 85-0012. We have examined these inventories and are requesting to review the files listed in Attachment B of this letter. Some information contained in these files may have already been provided to the Review Board or deposited at the National Archives. However, in order to ensure that all Secret Service records pertaining to the assassination of President Kennedy have been accounted for, the Review Board would like to review these files. Furthermore, if the Secret Service has any other inventories, indices, or other finding aids available for

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relevant records (that it has not yet provided to the Review Board), we request that these be made available for our inspection.

C. Additional, miscellaneous requests:

- 1. The Warren Commission was provided with synopses of Protective Research Section cases established in Dallas, Texas during 1963. These appear at Warren Commission Exhibit No. 762. It is unclear whether the Secret Service provided the Warren Commission with the actual files or only synopses. Accordingly, the Review Board would like to know whether the Secret Service still maintains the following files, and if so, we are requesting that you make them available for our inspection: (1) CO-2-34,007; (2) CO-2-33,996; (3) CO-2-33,664; (4) CO-2- 34,785.
- 2. Please provide any information available regarding the Secret Service's procedure for making Secret Service Identification Documentation for its agents and employees during the time period of 1961 1963.
- 3. The Review Board would like to inspect Secret Service personnel directories from 1961 1963.
- 4. It is our understanding that Secret Service Personnel visited James Rowley at his private home in 1992, and may have inventoried records, and videotaped their visit. Please confirm whether this occurred, and if so, please provide any videotapes, written materials, or other information that describe or document the Secret Service's visit with Mr. Rowley at his private home in 1992. Your response to this request should include a list of materials identified or obtained in connection with the Secret Service's visit to the Rowley home. Also, please provide information that describes or documents other such visits with Secret Service officials who may have had a role in the Kennedy assassination.
- 5. The May 14, 1998 edition of *The Washington Post* reported that the Secret Service "produced rare photographs of John F. Kennedy's fateful 1963 motorcade through Dallas" at a May meeting between the Secret Service and the office of the independent counsel. The Board would like to know whether these photographs are duplicates of photographs that have already been deposited at the National Archives by the Secret Service or made available to the Review Board. If they are not, the Board requests to

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see these and any other photographs pertaining to the assassination of President Kennedy and to the November, 1963 trip to Texas that are among the Secret Service's records.

By making these requests, we are not designating these materials "assassination records." To the extent that this request presents logistical or other difficulties that we may not have anticipated, or to the extent that these records may be located in the National Archives at a place other than the JFK Collection, we will be happy to discuss with you ways in which the request might be amended.

We appreciate your assistance.
