SUBJECT: DOJ (Leadership Offices) Compliance with JFK Act

On Friday, March 13, 1998, I met with Melanie Pustay and Carmen Mallon of DOJ -- Office of Information and Privacy ("OIP") to review the status of work that must be completed by OIP under the JFK Act. The following was done:

1. We reviewed the Edward Levi and Griffin Bell records that we had preliminarily selected as assassination records (*see* October 9, 1997 Letter from R. Haron to M. Pustay), and made a more refined selection. An additional file entitled, "JB/Professor Poplin," from Box 33 of Accession No. 60-82-20 was designated an assassination record.

2. Ms. Pustay would determine whether there are any additional classified files of E. Levi or G. Bell that were not yet reviewed.

3. Copies of certain documents were provided to me as "additional information" (these records related to FBI record keeping). Ms. Pustay would also attempt to locate certain records which we requested. They were a file entitled "FBI/Hoover files" (Box 14, Accession No. 60-82-20) and a November 15, 1975 FBI memo re its Administrative Index (in file "FBI/Responses to February Memo to Director," Box 15, Accession No. 60-82-20).

4. OIP is awaiting clearance from FBI and the Criminal Division with respect to referrals made by OIP. I offered to follow up with FBI and the Criminal Division.

5. Ms. Pustay would make Box 7 (Accession No. 60-81-164 -- Civiletti) available for review.

6. Ms. Pustay would call Bernie Bergland (202-514-6283) to make available the SF-135's which he has for the Department of Justice. These will be reviewed if time permits.
