Dear Mr. Bronson:

I understand that you were able to speak with a member of my staff recently concerning the film taken by your client, Mr. Charles Bronson, on November 22, 1963, in Dallas, Texas. The Assassination Records Review Board has been given the responsibility by Congress to identify and secure all records related to the assassination of President Kennedy, and we regard your client's files as an important record. Unlike those of past efforts, the ARRB's mandate does not include an investigation of the assassination. We are charged with ensuring that all relevant records are preserved and available to the American people.

Your client's files should be a part of our John F. Kennedy Assassination Record Collection at the National Archives in College Park, Maryland, where it will receive the world's best conservation treatment and will be available for generations to come.

I am enclosing some literature about the ARRB and look forward to discussing this matter with you and your client.
