Dear Ms. Rundle:

By way of introduction, the Assassination Records Review Board (ARRB) is an independent federal agency created to oversee the identification and release of records related to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

The ARRB was established by the President John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection Act of 1992 (PL 102-526) and was signed into law by President George Bush. The law gives the ARRB the mandate and authority to identify, secure, and make available all records related to the assassination of President Kennedy. I am faxing a three page fact sheet about the Review Board along with this letter. I will send a copy of our legislation and a brochure about the John F. Kennedy Records Collection by Federal Express.

The scope of the Review Board's mandate includes assassination-related records in the custody of federal agencies, local and state government entities, as well as those in the private sector. It has come to my attention that in approximately 1967 former assistant state attorney Alfonso Sepe may have conducted what he termed a "super-secret investigation" into statements made by right wing extremist Joseph Milteer concerning the assassination of President Kennedy. As you may recall, Milteer made his statements to a police informant, Willie Somersett. Somersett tape recorded the statements. The Review Board is interested in obtaining, for the John F. Kennedy Records Collection, the files your office may have created at any time from 1963 through 1967, or later, concerning Joseph Milteer and his associates.

I will be in Miami on October 5 and the morning of October 6 and would like to meet with you or

someone from your office to discuss the above mentioned records, as well Katherine Fernandez Rundle, Esq.

as any other assassination related records you may have. I apologize for such short notice; however, I was only recently authorized to make this trip.
