Steve Tilley of the JFK Collection at Archives II suggested I contact you concerning some assassination-related records of which I have recently become aware. In the course of reviewing records held by a private source from New Orleans, I found numerous notations of several Federal Court cases that were filed in the Federal District Court, Eastern District of Louisiana, the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals, and the United States Supreme Court. All of the cases appear to have been filed in collateral issues stemming from Jim Garrison's prosecution of Clay Shaw in New Orleans in the late 1960s. As such, the Federal Court records are assassination records under the John F. Kennedy Records Collection Act.

Mr. Tilley asked me to tell you that he does not remember ever having received any Clay Shaw/Jim Garrison related files from your office. He told me he does have the court files you sent him from the Marina Oswald case, the Joe King case, and the In Re: One Mannlicher-Carcanno Rifle case.

If it is of any help to you or your staff in finding the files and sending them to Mr. Tilley, I've located the following information:
