## THE NATIONAL ARCHIVES TO OPEN ADDITIONAL JFK INFORMATION

Washington, DC ... On (X DATE), the National Archives will make available to the public FBI, CIA, and House Select Committee on Assassinations (HSCA) documents relating to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy in accordance with the President John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection Act of 1992. All of the documents have been publicly available, but many previously contained technical redactions. They will now be available either in their entirety or with fewer redactions.

The JFK Assassination Records Review Board has the authority to release materials related to the assassination of President Kennedy that have previously been withheld by Federal agencies. The Board voted on October 24, 1995 to release these documents in full or in part. They include:

37 FBI documents (including duplicates) that cover various aspects of the FBI investigation into the assassination of President Kennedy. Several FBI documents in this group are duplicates of ones previously released that were located elsewhere in the FBI filing system.

197 CIA documents that relate primarily to Lee Harvey Oswald's trip to Mexico City in the fall of 1963, before the assassination of President Kennedy.

95 pages (in full) of a report written by the staff of the HSCA entitled Oswald in Mexico City (commonly identified as the Lopez Report). The Report was largely declassified in 1993, but contained many redactions.

The original documents will be available for researchers from the textual research room at the National Archives facility in College Park, MD, located at 8601 Adelphi Road.
