Thank you for your recent letter to Mr. John Tunheim, Chair of the Review Board, regarding documents released by the Board which relate to Lee Harvey Oswald's reported trip to Mexico City before the assassination of President Kennedy. Mr. Tunheim asked me to respond to you.

The Review Board has received a large volume of information regarding the assassination from the public. All of this information, including what you have provided to the Board, will be carefully reviewed to ensure that the Board accomplishes its mandate in an effective and efficient manner. As I know you are aware, it is not the Board's responsibility under the law to answer the questions that remain concerning the assassination and its aftermath. It is our duty to do our best to find all of the remaining assassination records and secure them at the National Archives so that the public has full access to them.
