## THE NATIONAL ARCHIVES TO OPEN ADDITIONAL JFK ASSASSINATION RECORDS

College Park, MD. . On Tuesday, July 2, 1996, the National Archives will make available to the public an additional 193 FBI, CIA and House Select Committee on Assassination (HSCA) records relating to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy in accordance with the President John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection Act of 1992.

While these documents, in redacted form, are already part of the Collection, they will now be available either in their entirety or with fewer redactions. The JFK Assassination Records Review Board, an independent Federal agency, has the authority to recommend release of materials relating to the assassination of President Kennedy that have been previously withed by Federal agencies. The Board voted to release these documents in full or in part at its April meeting. The FBI documents chronicle various aspects of the Bureau's post-assassination investigation. The CIA documents are from the Agency's large Oswald "201" file and primarily relate to their post-assassination investigation.
