Thank you for your letter of May 30, 1996 regarding your work and several suggested leads for locating assassination records.

First, I am aware of the research that you have done relative to the Secret Service and assassination. Unfortunately, I missed your 1995 COPA presentation. However, a few other members of the staff did see your presentation and based on what they told me, I regret that I could not stay for it that day.

Second, I would like to ask you to consider whether or not any of the materials from your research would enrich the JFK Collection at the National Archives. Perhaps some of your interviews, if recorded, represent original oral histories given by primary players in the assassination history that might be of value to the Collection. We would appreciate hearing your thoughts and learning what interviews you have accumulated during your research.

Third, the Review Board appreciates your suggestions. As I am sure you are aware, we have received thousands of suggested leads regarding the existence and location of assassination records. We are attempting to process these in an effective and efficient manner. Please be assured that your suggestions will be carefully considered. I have already provided copies of your letter to the appropriate staff members.
