I am writing as a follow-up to your recent telephone conversation with Sydney Reddy of our staff and would like to take this opportunity to further introduce you to the Assassination Records Review Board, an independent federal agency created by The President John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection Act of 1992 (PL 102-526) to oversee the review and release of records related to the assassination of President Kennedy. President Clinton appointed the five members of the Board in April 1994. I have enclosed a fact sheet on the Review Board for your additional information.

An important part of the Review Board's mandate, as articulated by the United States Congress, is to compile at the National Archives as complete a record of the assassination as possible. The Congress clearly stated that the Review Board was to search beyond the records of previous governmental investigations and seek relevant assassination records that are in private hands.

The Review Board is very interested in discussing whether or not you or other members of your family have any materials possibly in your possession, that could have been left by your late father, Will Fritz, which may be relevant to the record of the assassination which we are compiling as part of our mandate. Hearing from you on this topic would be very helpful.
