* I spent the two and one-half days I was in the office catching up on my recent nine day trip to New Orleans, Baton Rouge and Miami and preparing for my upcoming five day trip to Tampa, St. Louis, Springfield, Illinois and Chicago.

* Interviewed former Dallas Police Department Crime Lab employee Rusty Livingstone concerning assassination records. (*Note: He is Gary Savage's uncle and the co-author of "First Day Evidence"*) He has approximately 50 first generation copies of photographs of various items of evidence seized from Ruth Paine's home (mostly Oswald's personal effects) and views of the sixth floor area. He also has several carbon copies of police reports and fingerprint cards from Oswald's arrest. Livingstone said he would consider donating the items to the the JFK Collection. (*Note: Dave received a much better response from Livingstone than I received from Gary Savage. I've asked Dave to read their book and to draft a letter to Livingstone requesting that he donate the photographs and other memorabilia to the JFK Collection.*)

* Spoke with Roger Meade of the Los Alamos Laboratory regarding testing the lab conducted on the Nix film for the HSCA. Provided some HSCA RIF's and documents to help the lab find its records from 1978.

* Contacted Schyler Borton of UPI's legal department in Washington concerning its possession of the Nix and Muchmore films. Borton agreed to initiate a search for records concerning the films when they receive our request for the same in writing. (*I approved a letter that Jerrie will send today.*)

* Interviewed Dealey Plaza witness Joyce Maurine Stansberry. She claimed she has never been interviewed before, although she worked in the TSBD. She does not know of any records but offered to search her home and will contact us if she finds any. She is willing to assist the ARRB's work in

any way she can.

* Interviewed Dealey Plaza witness J. Willard (Sandy) Speaker. He provided information about two other witnesses, Milican and Brennan. He also does not think he has any records but will check and notify us if he finds any. He too is willing to assist us further.

* Continued correspondence with Jim Marrs concerning the Deed of Gift he requested for the photograph and copies of maps and letters he donated to the Collection.
