NATIONAL SECURITY FILE

Name File

The NSF Name File is composed primarily of folders on the members of the National Security staff during the Johnson Administration. The file also contains folders on some Presidential aides, Senators, and former Presidents who were involved in national security issues. The following description contains biographic information on the people who have folders in the NSF Name File.

RUSSELL A. ASH was a senior staff member of the National Security Council from 1954-1972. His areas of responsibility included

NSC

personnel security matters, internal security coordination for the NSC, and the President's Foreign Intelligence Advisory Board.

FRANCIS BATOR came to the NSC staff in April of 1964 and was appointed Deputy Special Assistant to the President and senior NSC staff member in 1965. His basic areas of responsibility included European affairs and foreign economic policy. He played a major role in the defense of the dollar and the pound, and the coordination of the Kennedy Round.

SAMUEL BELK was on the NSC staff from 1959 to 1965 concentrating on African issues.

WILLIAM BOWDLER was a senior staff member of the NSC from 1956

to

1968, on detail from the Department of State. He was responsible for Latin American affairs. Mr. Bowdler was responsible for compiling the NSC History (available at the Library) on the Panama Crisis, 1964.

COLONEL RICHARD BOWMAN was detailed from the Department of Defense to the NSC from 1964 to 1966 and served as the NSC liaison officer with the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

WILLIAM H. BRUBECK was assigned to the NSC from the Department

of

State from 1963 to 1964 and was responsible for African issues.

JOSEPH CALIFANO was a Special Assistant to President Johnson from July 1965 to January 1969. His main responsibility was as coordinator of Johnson's legislative program.

DOUGLASS CATER was a Special Assistant to President Johnson from May 1964 to October 1968. He became Johnson's expert on education, health and welfare issues.

to GORDON CHASE was detailed from the Department of State in 1962 the National Security Council staff. In 1965 he accepted a regular appointment on the National Security Staff where he worked until January 1966. He served as McGeorge Bundy's personal assistant and as liaison with the UN.

of CHESTER COOPER began working for the White House in the summer 1964, coordinating foreign policy aspects of the President's campaign speeches, and became a regular member of the NSC staff soon after the November 1964 election. He served as a senior staff member until April 1966 with responsibilities for Far East issues, Vietnam, and Canada.

NATHANIEL DAVIS was a senior staff member of the NSC responsible for Eastern Europe (including the Czech crisis), Russia and the UN.

on JOHN DeLUCA was a White House Fellow assigned to the NSC from October 1965 until September 1966. He assisted Chester Cooper Vietnam non-military programs. He also watched and analyzed Communist bloc matters.

LAWRENCE EAGLEBURGER was a member of the NSC staff from 1966 to 1967 concentrating on European affairs.

PRESIDENT DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER was President from January 1953 until January 1961.

MICHAEL FORRESTAL (whose areas of expertise were in Far Eastern matters), was a staff member of the NSC staff from January 1962 until April 1964. In April 1964, Mr. Forrestal left the NSC staff to serve as a special assistant to the Secretary of State for Vietnam affairs and chairman of the Intergovernmental Coordinating Committee on Vietnam.

EDWARD FRIED was a senior staff member of the NSC who was responsible for Western Europe, NATO, monetary policy, and trade, including East-West trade.

SENATOR J. WILLIAM FULBRIGHT was a US Senator from 1945 to 1974 and a member of the Committee on Finance, the Joint Economic Committee, and chairman of the Committee on Foreign Relations.

of COLONEL ROBERT GINSBURGH was a senior staff member of the NSC from 1966 until 1968. His areas of responsibility included military and negotiating aspects of Vietnam, military aspects NATO and the Czech crisis, and liaison with the Joint Chiefs of Staff. Mr. Ginsburgh compiled the NSC History on the March 31st speech (available at the Library).

ERNEST GOLDSTEIN was a Special Assistant to President Johnson from September 1967 until December 1968. He concentrated on domestic affairs, cabinet meetings, and fiscal and economic matters.

EDWARD HAMILTON was a senior staff member of the NSC on detail from the Bureau of the Budget from October 1965 until December 1968. His areas of responsibility included Africa, India-Pakistan, and aid problems in general.

ULRIC HAYNES was a NSC staff member from 1965 to 1966 concentrating on African affairs.

VICE PRESIDENT HUBERT H. HUMPHREY was Vice President from January 1965 until January 1969.

His ALFRED JENKINS was a Foreign Service Officer detailed to the National Security Council from July 1966 until January 1969. area of responsibility included China issues. Mr. Jenkins compiled the NSC History of the Pueblo Crisis, which is at the Johnson Library.

WALTER JENKINS was a Special Assistant to President Johnson from November 1963 until October 1964.

PETER JESSUP was on detail to the NSC from January 1964 until January 1969. He was responsible for intelligence matters.

He CHARLES E. JOHNSON was a senior member of the NSC staff from October 1962 through the close of the Johnson administration. handled scientific matters, weaponry, arms control, atomic energy, and space matters. He served as the NSC liaison with

the

AEC and NASA.

as

JIM R. JONES was appointed Assistant to the President under Marvin Watson in February 1965. In January 1968, he was named Deputy Special Assistant and in May he was promoted to Special Assistant. His duties included congressional liaison, and from January 1968, he served as President Johnson's Appointments Secretary.

WILLIAM J. JORDEN was a senior member of the NSC staff from May 1966 until May 1968, when he became a member of the US delegation to the Paris Peace Talks on Vietnam. His basic areas of responsibility were Southeast and East Asia, especially Vietnam but also including Japan, Korea, Burma, and other Asian nations. He also dealt with the press.

to

SPURGEON KEENY was a senior member of the NSC staff from 1963 1969. His areas of responsibility included military technology, disarmament, arms control, and scientific aspects of weapons. Mr. Keeny compiled the NSC History of the Non-Proliferation Treaty, which is available at the LBJ Library.

SENATOR ROBERT F. KENNEDY was United States Senator for New York from 1965 to 1968.

ROBERT E. KINTNER was appointed as Secretary to the Cabinet and Special Assistant to President Johnson in April 1966. He resigned in June 1967.

DAVID KLEIN was a senior member of the NSC staff on detail from the Department of State from March 1962 to August 1965. His areas of responsibility included Western and Eastern European affairs.

ROBERT KOMER was appointed an NSC staff assistant to McGeorge Bundy in 1961. In 1965 he was named Deputy Special Assistant

he

the President for National Security Affairs, and the following year he was made Special Assistant to the President. In 1967

left the NSC to become Deputy for Pacification in Vietnam. His areas of expertise on the NSC staff included the Middle East, South Asia, and Africa.

COLONEL WILLIAM LEMNITZER was detailed to the NSC from the Army in 1968. He served as the NSC liaison with the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

MIKE MANATOS was a White House legislative aide during the Kennedy and Johnson administrations. He joined the White House staff in 1961 and served under Lawrence O'Brien, President Kennedy's special assistant for Congressional relations. Until 1969, he worked as a liaison with the Senate's Democrats.

SENATOR MIKE MANSFIELD was United States Senator from Montana from 1952 to 1976. He was the majority leader, a member of the Committee on Foreign Relations and the Appropriations Committee, and chairman of the Democratic Foreign Policy Committee and the Democratic Steering Committee.

RICHARD MOOSE was a junior NSC staff member from 1967 to 1968. He served as the NSC Press-Congressional Liaison and helped to coordinate Presidential Press Secretary George Christian's shop with State and Defense press operations.

ROGER MORRIS was on the NSC staff from October 1967 until 1973. His areas of responsibility included Africa south of the Sahara. He also helped Hal Saunders with South Asia, particularly India, Pakistan and Ceylon. Morris was the NSC staffer who compiled

the

NSC Histories (available at the Johnson Library) on the Congo Crisis and the President's Speech on Third Anniversary of Organization of African Unity, May 26, 1966.

BILL MOYERS was the Deputy Director of the Peace Corps in 1963, Special Assistant to the President from 1964 to 1967, Chief of Staff in the White House from October 1964 to January 1967, and White House Press Secretary from July 1965 to January 1967.

RICHARD NEUSTADT served as a consultant to President Johnson from 1964 to 1966 while also a professor of political science at the John F. Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University.

HAYES REDMON was an assistant to Presidential Press Secretary Bill Moyers in the Press Office from 1964 to 1967.

JOHN ROCHE served as a Special Consultant to the President from 1966 to 1968, writing speeches for President Johnson and doing advance work on some of his foreign trips.

DONALD ROPA was a junior staff officer on detail to the NSC from 1965 until May 1967. He assisted Chester Cooper on Southeast Asia, including the following countries: Thailand, Cambodia, Malaysia, Indonesia, and the Philippines.

of
WALT ROSTOW was appointed Deputy Special Assistant to President Kennedy in January 1961. In November 1961 he became chairman

the State Department Policy Planning Council. In May 1964, President Johnson also appointed Rostow to the post of U.S. representative to the Inter-American Committee on the Alliance for Progress. On March 31, 1966, President Johnson appointed Rostow Special Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs, succeeding McGeorge Bundy who had resigned. In this capacity Rostow directed the NSC staff, served as liaison with the Departments of State and Defense, Joint Chiefs of Staff, and the CIA, and supervised the White House foreign intelligence system and the Situation Room.

HAROLD K. SAUNDERS was a junior member of the NSC staff from 1961 to 1966 assisting Robert Komer. He was a senior member from 1967 to 1974 and was responsible for the Middle East and North Africa. He was the NSC staffer who compiled the following NSC Histories: the Middle East Crisis, and the Indian Famine.

a
ROBERT SAYRE served as senior member of the NSC staff from April 1964 until April 1965. His area of responsibility was Latin America and included work on the following issues: Chamizal problems, salinity in the Colorado River Basin, and plans for
new canal in or near Panama.

LOUIS SCHWARTZ was a Foreign Affairs Officer assigned to the NSC staff from March 1968 until January 1969 who served as a NSC press liaison and worked with the Vietnam Information Group.

is
BROMLEY SMITH served as the Executive Secretary of the NSC from 1961 to 1969. In this capacity he kept track of the NSC daily business and was the executive manager. Mr. Smith compiled the NSC History on Deployment of Major US Forces to Vietnam, which
available at the Johnson Library.

JAMES THOMSON was a junior member of the NSC staff from July 1964 to September 1966, serving under Chester Cooper in Far Eastern

affairs. His areas of expertise included China, Burma, Cambodia, and Indonesia.

PRESIDENT HARRY S. TRUMAN was President of the United States from April 12, 1945 to January 1953.

RICHARD ULLMAN was a junior member of the NSC staff for 1967.

He

worked under Edward Fried on Western Europe, balance of payments problems, and international trade policy, including East-West trade.

JACK VALENTI was a Special Assistant to President Johnson from November 1963 to May 1966. His duties included speechwriting, appointments, scheduling, and other tasks for President Johnson.

MARVIN WATSON was a Special Assistant to President Johnson from January 1965 to April 1968. He served as appointments secretary, political advisor, office manager, and chief of staff.

W. HOWARD WRIGGINS was a senior staff member of the NSC from 1966 to 1967. His areas of responsibility were the Middle East and South Asia.

MARSHALL WRIGHT was a senior member of the NSC staff from 1967

to

1968 and 1970 to 1972. His area of responsibility was the Far East in general and the political and economic aspects of Vietnam. Mr. Wright compiled the following NSC Histories (available at the Library): Gulf of Tonkin, Honolulu Conference, and the Manila Conference.

The material in these folders is not always indicative of the responsibilities of these NSC staffers. Many NSC staffers have very small folders in this file but have substantial material incorporated into other NSF files.

- 1 * "Ash Memos" [1966-1967]
Russell Ash's folder contains a small amount of material reflecting his responsibility for internal security matters.
- * "Bator Memos" [1964-1967]
This folder contains material on the following subjects: Prime Minister Wilson's visit in 1967, the European economic situation, European trade issues, NATO, 1967 tax proposals, textile imports, balance of payments, tripartite nuclear talks, Vietnam, and foreign aid.
- * "Belk Memos" [1964]
Consists of a memo regarding foreign service training.
- * "Bowdler Memos" [1965-1968]
This folder includes memoranda on:
British-Honduran mediation, tuna boat seizures, the Council on Latin America, Javits Amendment to the Aid Bill of 1966, the Rio Conference, Argentinean-Chilean shooting incident, visits of US officials to Latin America, Mrs. Johnson's proposed trip to Latin America, the dispute over Ankoko Island, and Cuban guerrilla support. Also contained in this folder are general summaries of Latin American developments and material on the following countries: Cuba, Peru, Chile, Mexico, Haiti, Venezuela, Bolivia, Colombia,

Uruguay, Belize, Panama, Brazil, Ecuador, and the Dominican Republic.

- * "Colonel Bowman Memos" [1965-1966]
Includes memoranda on Vietnam, the President's Omaha speech, a proposal for a North American international school for community development, Joint Chiefs of Staff activities, the growing independence of countries of the Free World, and national planning.
- * "Brubeck Memos" [1964]
Small file containing material on the 1964 foreign aid bill, automobile parts tariff, and CAB international air rights.
- * "Califano Memos" [1966-1967]
Contains material on: a cease fire in the Middle East, the use of university resources in foreign policy research, domestic sugar prices, establishment of a Committee on Foreign Aid, legislative programs, the New Delhi Conference, the Rent Supplement Program, and Califano's remarks on Government Management.
- * "Cater Memos" [1964-1966]
Small file containing material on Vietnam, White House news regarding foreign policy, and the government information program on foreign affairs.
- * "Chase, G." [1964-1966]
Contains materials on the following: the Dominican Republic, Southern Rhodesia, Panama, PL 480, proposed Presidential trips to Latin America and San Francisco, and various Presidential speeches and appointments.
- 2 * "Cooper Memos" [1964-1966]
Contains memoranda on Southeast Asia and the Vietnam situation, suggestions for various Presidential speeches, campaign preparations, and the international rice situation.
- * "Davis Memos" [1965-1966]
Contains reports of Davis' contacts with journalists and Congressmen, memoranda analyzing

UN issues, memoranda of conversations between Davis and numerous Eastern European and Soviet officials, and other material on Eastern European countries and the Soviet Union.

* "DeLuca Memos" [1965-1966]
Contains material on West European communism, the PCI (an Italian political party), and the creation of an office for Religious Liaison.

* "Eagleburger Memos" [1966-1967]
Small file containing material on the NATO trilateral talks and reports of Eagleburger's meetings with officials from the Yugoslavian embassy.

* "Eisenhower, Dwight D., General" [1954-1968]
Contains briefings of the former President from 1964 to 1968 dealing with Vietnam, the Middle East, Soviet missile and nuclear programs, General de Gaulle, the Dominican Republic, Rhodesia, and the Indo-Pak struggle for Kashmir. Also in this folder are materials on Eisenhower's public statements on Vietnam.

3 * "President Eisenhower" [1965-1968]
Contains briefings, lists of bipartisan Congressional meetings held by Johnson and by Eisenhower, lists of Johnson's contacts with Eisenhower (both pre-Presidential and Presidential), and statements of Eisenhower on Vietnam.

* [Eisenhower] "8/20/65--Material taken by General Goodpaster to Gettysburg"

Contains briefings of Eisenhower on Vietnam and materials on the Collective Defense Treaty, the situation in Southeast Asia, and US policy therein.

* "Forrestal Memos" [1964-1965]
Small file containing material on Forrestal's 1965 trip to the Far East and memoranda analyzing Far Eastern and Vietnamese matters.

* "Fried Memos" [1967-1968]

This folder contains one biographic memo on Fried and a note regarding an appointment for the American Consulate General of Germany with a Department of Commerce official.

- * "Senator Fulbright" [1966-1967]
Contains materials on the Rio Treaty, economic development loans, Vietnam, the Middle East arms race, and the role of Congress in determining foreign policy.
- * "Colonel Ginsburgh Memos" [1966-1968]
Contains memoranda reflecting Ginsburgh's role as liaison with the JCS and reporting his conversations with press people on Vietnam. There is also some information on military assistance and US troop strength in Europe.
- * "Goldstein Memos" [1967-1968]
Contains memoranda on the Department of Treasury's foreign and domestic business responsibilities, US stockpiles, law of the sea issues, and Goldstein's 1968 trip to Paris.
- * "Hamilton Memos" [1965-1968]
Contains materials on India, Africa, negotiations on Vietnam, Asian Bank bills, the World Bank and regional banks, foreign aid, and campaign data cards.
- * "Haynes Memos" [1965-1966]
Contains reports of conversations with columnists regarding African problems and memoranda on numerous sub-Saharan African countries.
- 4 * [Humphrey] "Vice President, Vol. 1"
Contains material on the following: military spending of the Shah of Iran, Humphrey's conversations with representatives of the anti-Sukarno forces, Vietnam, Laos, invitations to Congressmen to visit Cambodia, Humphrey's East Asian trips, Humphrey's conversations with Norman Cousins on US-Vietnam policy, conversations with Kosygin on India and Vietnam, India-Pakistan relations, the Latin American agricultural situation, Cuba, US relations with Eastern

European countries, the US food supply situation, the sale of wheat to Russia, the visit of Pope Paul to the UN, Vice Presidential speeches, and Vice Presidential meetings with Brazilian, Japanese, Venezuelan, German, Peruvian, and Italian officials.

- * [Humphrey] "Vice President, Vol. 2" [7/66-5/68]
Contains Vice Presidential speeches and drafts and materials on: PL 480, Soviet sunflower oil, Italian floods in 1966, the Vice President's visit to the Korean inaugural, the Non-Proliferation Treaty, the Italian Socialist party, NATO, Vietnam, Indonesia, Latin America, France, the Middle East, and North Africa.

- 5 * "Jenkins Memos" [Alfred] [1966-1969]
Contains material on East Asia (principally China), and memoranda relating Jenkins' press contacts.

- * "Jenkins Memos" [Walter] [1964]
Small file containing memoranda for White House office personnel dealing with administrative issues, and material on the presence of American troops in NATO.

- * "Jessup Memos" [1964-1968]
Contains materials on educational TV, psychological and social research, the Dominican Republic, the Asia Foundation, and Soviet military strength.

- * "C. Johnson Memos" [1965-1968]
Contains memoranda on: nuclear matters (including civil uses of nuclear engineering, supply of nuclear materials to France, the Nuclear Test Ban Treaty, and the AEC), cooperation between Soviets and US in space, NASA activities, nautical and marine matters, the Star III Research Submarine, repatriation of the Bikini Islanders, and visits of foreign ambassadors to US scientific institutions.

- * "Jim Jones Memos" [1966-1968]
Small file containing memoranda reflecting Jones'

role as Assistant Appointments Secretary to Pres. Johnson.

- * "Jordan Memos" [1966-1968]
Reports of Jordan's conversations with the press and material on Vietnam and East Asia in general.
- * "Spurgeon Keeny Memos" [1964-1968]
Contains reports of meetings with officials attached to the Soviet embassy, memoranda of Keeny's conversations with journalists, and memoranda on the Soviet Union, Czechoslovakia, India, the Outer Space Treaty, civil uses of atomic energy, ABM deployment, and the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty.
- * "Senator Robert Kennedy Memos and Misc." [1966-1967]
Contains memoranda on a Kennedy statement on Africa and on the Rio Conference, correspondence regarding his February 1967 speech on China, and a transcript of a
1967 interview with Robert Kennedy on the "Today" show.
- 5 * "Kintner Memos" [1966-1967]
Contains speech drafts, memoranda on Johnson's foreign and domestic policy speeches, and policy guidelines regarding Vietnam.
- * "Klein Memos" [1964-1965]
Contains memoranda on NATO, the United Kingdom, France, West Germany, Italy, Vietnam, and Eastern Europe (particularly Rumania and the USSR).
- 6 * "Komer Memos, Vol. 1" [1/63-8/65]
Contains reports on Komer's conversations with the press and materials on the following: India, Pakistan, the Middle East, Cyprus, North Africa, Vietnam, Indonesia, Malaysia, balance of payments, foreign aid, and population control.
- * "Komer Memos, Vol. 2" [9/65-5/66]
Contains material on India and Pakistan, Vietnam, the Middle East, Africa, a possible fertilizer consortium and the World Bank, world wheat supplies, and reports on Komer's conversations

with the press.

- * "Col. Lemnitzer Memos" [1968]
Folder consists of one 1968 memorandum from Rostow to the President regarding Lemnitzer's helping Robert Ginsburgh on the NSC staff.
- * "Manatos Memos" [1966-1967]
Small file containing memoranda on Manatos' Congressional correspondence and contacts, mainly regarding foreign policy issues.
- * "Senator Mansfield" [1966-1967]
Contains correspondence between Mansfield and the President and other materials on Vietnam and US policy therein, the US-Mexico Interparliamentary Conference, the Mansfield Resolution, and Mansfield's proposed trip to the USSR, Mongolia, and China.
- * "Vietnam--Mansfield Memo and Reply" [1964-1967]
Consists of memoranda regarding Mansfield's views and proposals on the Vietnam War.
- 7 * "Moose Memos" [1967]
Contains reports of Moose's contacts with the press, instructions for the White House Press Office in dealing with military and foreign affairs inquiries, Sen. Thomas Kuchel's remarks regarding the election in Vietnam, and requests to Walt Rostow for appointments with various reporters.
- * "R. Morris Memos" [1968]
Small file with material on a Morris meeting with a TASS correspondent and on building peace throughout the world.
- * "Moyers Memos" [1964-1966]
Contains material on Indonesia, Latin America, meetings with press correspondents, and notes for and drafts of foreign policy speeches.
- * "Neustadt Memos" [1964-1965]

Consists primarily of memoranda regarding Neustadt's proposals on foreign policy, particularly concerning NATO and Western European/US relations.

- * "Redmon Memos" [1966]
Contains one memorandum on facts to fight inflation.
- * "Roche Memos" [1967-1968]
Contains memoranda on Vietnam, China, Cuba, and Roche's contacts with the press.
- * "Ropa Memos" [1965-1967]
Contains memoranda on Vietnam and other East Asian countries, US aid to Asian countries, and Senate speech drafts for foreign aid debates.
- * "Rostow Memos" [1966-1968]
Large file with information on: staffing of the NSC and personnel issues, the domestic economic situation, wage and price guidelines, Sen. Gruening's views on birth control legislation, foreign aid, the situation in Vietnam, China, McCloy's report on NATO, PM Wilson's cabinet changes, Latin America, and the Middle East. Also included are reports on Rostow's press contacts, a speech draft on Vietnam, and agendas for some Tuesday luncheons and NSC meetings.
- * "Saunders Memos" [1965-1968]
Contains memoranda on India, Pakistan, North Africa, Greece, AID, the Middle East, and relations between various Middle Eastern nations and Vietnam.
- 8 * "Sayre Memos" [1964-1965]
Contains material on Latin America, primarily in reports of staff meetings of the State Department's Bureau of American Republic's Affairs (ARA). This folder also contains some material on the Colorado River bill.
- * "Lou Schwartz" [1968]
Small file containing Schwartz's reports on his

contacts with the press.

- * "Smith Memos" [1967]
Contains three memos: on a meeting between JFK and Eisenhower, on LBJ's breakfast meeting with Sen. Mansfield and Amb. Goldberg, and on the guarding of a munitions warehouse in Alexandria, Virginia.
- * "Thomson Memos" [1964-1966]
Contains memoranda on Poland, China, Vietnam, and the situation in Southeast Asia in general.
- * "Former President Truman" [1967-1968]
Contains material on policy briefings on the Middle East for former President Truman.
- * "Ullman Memos" [1967]
Small file containing Ullman's reports on conversations with Soviet officials.
- * [Valenti File regarding the Dominican Republic] [1965]
Contains material on the Dominican Intervention of 1965, including lists of meetings and calls, a list of State Department initiatives during this crisis, and memoranda analyzing Communist participation.
- * "Watson Memos" [1966]
Three items: two on meetings, one on Vietnam.
- * "Wriggins Memos, 1966"
Contains memoranda on the following: Turkey, Afghanistan, Pakistan, India, Ceylon, the Middle East, Southeast Asia, foreign trade, and food aid.
- * "Wriggins Memos, 1967"
Contains memoranda on the above countries as well as Nepal, Yemen, and Algeria.
- * "Wright Memos" [1967-1968]
Small file containing memoranda on Indonesia, New Zealand, Australia, and Vietnam.
