### LATIN AMERICA AND THE WEST INDIES

This list includes the principal files in the Johnson Library that contain material on the countries of South and Central America and the islands of the West Indies. The list is not definitive, however, and researchers should consult with the Library's archivists about other potentially useful files. See also the list entitled "Foreign Economic Policy During The Johnson Presidency: Foreign Aid, Food for Peace and Third World Economic Development (Asia, Africa, and Latin America."

Unless otherwise noted, the files listed below have been processed, and the unclassified and declassified material has been opened for research. Folders marked with a double asterisk (\*\*) are unprocessed.

## NATIONAL SECURITY FILE (NSF)

This file was the working file of President Johnson's special assistants for national security affairs, McGeorge Bundy and Walt W. Rostow. Documents in the file originated in the offices of Bundy and Rostow and their staffs, in the various executive departments and agencies, especially those having to do with foreign affairs and national defense, and in diplomatic and military posts around the world.

About one-half of the National Security File has been processed and opened for research. Consult the finding aid in the reading room or borrow a copy through interlibrary loan by writing to the Supervisory Archivist, LBJ Library, 2313 Red River Street, Austin, Texas 78705. Those folders whose titles are preceded by an "X" or a date have been processed and their contents declassified in whole or in part. Lists of classified documents have been placed in those folders, and you may request mandatory declassification review of individual documents which have not yet been declassified in full. Those folders not preceded by an "X" or a date are unprocessed and are not subject to mandatory declassification review. Consult with a member of the staff on the processing schedule.

# NSF, Country File, Latin America

With the exception of some Cuba, Dominican Republic, and Haiti material, all of the Country Files for Latin American have been processed and the unclassified and declassified material opened for research. However, for several countries a substantial amount of material is still classified.

Security classified and other sensitive material sent to the White House Central Files was usually placed in the Confidential File. C.F. Subject File uses the same subject categories as WHCF. ### PRESIDENT'S APPOINTMENT FILE (DIARY BACKUP)

This file of backup material for the President's appointments includes schedules, briefing materials, memoranda of conversations, and other sources. Organized by date, there is a folder for almost every day of the administration. As a rule, the amount of foreign policy material is far greater for 1966-68 than for 1963-65. Diary Backup should be consulted for events such as the Punta del Este Conference (April 12-14, 1967), Johnson's meetings with Latin American heads of state, and crises such as the Dominican Republic intervention of 1965. The Diary Cards in the Reading Room provide an alphabetically arranged name index to the President's appointments. Once the date of an appointment has been determined, check the "Diaries and Logs" finding aid for the number of the appropriate box in Diary Backup. For more detailed information on the President's daily activities, consult the President's Daily Diary, a log of his appointments, phone calls, and other activities, arranged chronologically. ### **HANDWRITING FILE**

More than 15,000 pages of memos, notes, doodles, and other documents with Lyndon Johnson's handwriting (excluding material normally filed in the National Security File) were placed in a special Handwriting File during the Johnson presidency. Copies were frequently placed in the regular files, but some documents in this file cannot be found elsewhere (for example, the scratch pad notes collected by secretaries from the Oval Office and the Cabinet Room). The file is arranged chronologically, making it possible to check for material on Latin America for certain days or during limited periods. See this file, in particular, for material on the Dominican intervention.

Many White House aides maintained office files of their own, separate from the White House Central Files. The files of each aide reflect his or her responsibilities. ## LYNDON BAINES JOHNSON ARCHIVES 1931-1968 (LBJA)

In 1958, the Johnson staff instituted a records management program in the office which included a plan to dispose of noncurrent files. They set up the Lyndon Baines Johnson Archives to house items to be permanently retained rather than scheduled for disposal. Johnson files from the House and Senate period were screened, and selected items and files were moved to the LBJA file. Between 1958 and 1963, the staff continued to add to the file. Occasionally items were added during the White House period.
