## Outline of Proposed Questions for Robert Bouck (As of 4/29/96)

## **Principal Questions:**

- 1. <u>Document</u>: George G. Burkley memo for file of 11/27/63 regarding receipt of bone fragments.
  - A. Did you see the bone fragment referred to in the second paragraph of this memo? If so, please describe its size and appearance.
  - B. Chain-of-custody: who gave it to you? What do you remember about its chain-of-custody from the time found until you received it?
  - C. Are you aware of any measurements, written description, photographs or X-Rays having been made of it by anyone prior to you turning it over to Admiral Burkley?
- 2. Document: Letter from Robert I. Bouck to CAPT J. H. Stover, dated December 5, 1963.
  - A. When you recounted the individual sheets of film (and provided the corrected counts to CAPT Stover), were you counting sheets of film before developing, or after developing?
  - B. Please explain the statement "one holder loaded one side only" in item (a).
  - C. Are the items in the original Stover receipt of 11/22/63 (which you commented on in your December 5, 1963 letter) the only items of film that were transferred to you by Roy Kellerman, or were there others not noted in the Stover receipt or in your letter? (Such as unexposed, left-over film, for example.)
  - D. Does any explanation occur to you for the discrepancy between your letter (21 sheets of color film) and the Sibert-O'Neill Report (22 color photographs)?
- 3. <u>Documents</u>: Burkley inventory of April 26, 1965 and HSCA Bouck Interview Report of September 6, 1977.
  - A. Did you witness Dr. Burkley actually inventory all the materials on the 2-page inventory, or did you just witness him sign the inventory?
  - B. Did you witness the transfer of paragraph 9 materials to Mrs. Lincoln at the Archives?
  - C. Did Mrs. Lincoln inventory all the materials, or just sign the receipt without checking to see if all the items were there?

## Secondary Questions:

- 4. <u>Documents</u>: James Fox statement of February 16, 1967 and joint statement about photography signed by Bouck, Kellerman, Duncan, Fox and Kelley (February 1963).
  - A. Were the materials turned over to you by Roy Kellerman placed in a safe between November 23, 1963 and the time agent Fox first took outside the EOB to be developed (O/A)

November 27-29)?

- B. Compare approximate dates of developing in joint statement with dates on item 9 receipts from Burkley inventory--ask which is more likely to be accurate, (i.e., November 27, or November 29?) and also ask if he remembers anything about the contents of these two items listed on the Burkley receipt.
- C. Who tasked SA Fox to make black and white photos (prints)?
- D. Why did SA Fox take the photographs to the Navy At Anacostia? Did the USSS have any standing agreements with the NPC at Anacostia? Is there any reason why the film was not taken back to Bethesda where it was normally developed?
- E. In view of the numerous people who were at the autopsy who do not see photos in the present collection which they feel sure were taken that night, are you aware of any instances of destruction (or of borrowing), or even of any rumors of destruction (or of borrowing), of photographic materials while they were in the custody of the Secret Service between 1963-1965?
- 5. Document: HSCA Purdy Interview Report of September 6, 1977.
  - A. Can you remember who the Warren Commission staffer was who looked at the photographs? (If not, show him pictures of Rankin and Specter.)
