## Draft Question Outline for ARRB Depositions of 1963 Dallas (Parkland Hospital) Treating Physicians

- I. Professional Background, and Duties at Parkland. (Include experience with gunshot wounds.)
- II. How Notified that President Kennedy Had Been Wounded and Required Treatment; Circumstances of Each Doctor's Own Initial Involvement with Trauma Room One Activities.
- III. Draw, or Mark on, a Diagram of Trauma Room One, Where You were Standing During Treatment; Describe Your Own Activities During Treatment.
- IV. Describe Any Wounds You Saw on President Kennedy (in as precise a manner as possible). (If descriptions given are markedly inconsistent with earlier testimony or writings, ARRB Counsel may wish to test the witness as to why.)
- V. Sketch a Rendition of President Kennedy's Cranial Wound(s) As Observed at Parkland on an Anatomically Correct Skull Drawing.
- VI. Ask Whether the Deponent Had Any Opinion on 11/22/63 About the Number of Shots that Impacted the Body, Where on the Body, and from What Direction; Ask Whether That Opinion Has Changed Today, and If So, Why?
- VII. Exhibit Autopsy Images (color positive transparencies) that have been alleged by others, or may reasonably or possibly be interpreted, to depict the pre-incision condition of President Kennedy's Head at autopsy (namely, views 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6). Ask each witness whether each view matches, or does not match, his recollection of the head wound in Dallas, particularly at the last moment the President was seen. Ask the same questions about the tracheostomy incision.
- VIII. Allow Each Witness Ample Time to Make Any Comments Wished About Any Aspect of President Kennedy's Treatment, or About the Autopsy Images as They Relate to His Recollection of That Treatment.
- IX. Ask Whether the Deponent is Familiar With Writings on the JFK Assassination, And If So, Which Ones?
