Dear Mr. Williamson:

Thank you for meeting with us on June 11, 1996, to discuss the framework for possible photographic assistance by Kodak to the ARRB.

As you requested during our meeting, this letter forwards an enclosure that defines the maximum range of photographic films related to the assassination of President Kennedy that are of potential interest to the Review Board. If the Review Board ultimately decides to pursue any clarification of the photographic record, our requests are expected to fall within the universe defined by the enclosed list. Pursuant to your request, a photocopy of HSCA, Volume 6 is also provided, along with several technical reports of photographic analysis previously conducted on assassination-related photographs and motion picture films, all accomplished during the mid-and-late 1970s.

Although not all of this material will be of relevance to our specific interests, we wanted to send you all of the materials that have previously been generated. We would be happy to discuss with you the portions that may be the most relevant.

It is my understanding, as a result of our June 11 meeting, that you will forward these materials to Eastman Kodak at Rochester for study by experienced laboratory personnel so that Kodak and the ARRB can together better define the scope of tests now available with today's technology. The Review Board would not wish to repeat tests or procedures unless they would provide additional useful information.
