Dear Mr. Riebe:

Let me thank you for talking by phone with Doug Horne and me last July. We appreciated your cooperation, and I hope this letter finds you in good health.

The Assassination Records Review Board staff feels that your recollections of the events surrounding the autopsy on President Kennedy, and particularly of your role in the events surrounding the photographing of President Kennedy's autopsy, are essential to completing the historical record. Accordingly, we are hereby inviting you to come to Washington to view the official autopsy photographs, and answer questions under oath about your involvement in the events of November 22-23 at Bethesda National Naval Medical Center. (We can provide you with airplane tickets prior to your departure, and can reimburse you for other, normally allowable travel expenses afterwards, in accordance with the standard Federal travel regulations.) Our efforts to complete the historical record of the President's autopsy are ongoing, and we hope to receive your cooperation in ensuring that an official record of your best recollections are placed in the JFK Collection at the National Archives after the Review Board completes its work.

Doug Horne, a Senior Analyst with the ARRB who is very familiar with the photographic and medical issues related to the Kennedy assassination, and who has assisted me with the depositions of Drs. Humes, Boswell and Finck, as well as of Navy Civilian photographer John Stringer, will be calling you in the near future to discuss travel arrangements for the interview we are proposing. At this time, we propose to try to conduct your interview in mid-April, 1997, providing that is acceptable to you.
