Dear Mr. DeBrueys:

I would like to thank you again for taking time in June to meet with us. We very much appreciate your willingness to answer our questions and to share information from the Metropolitan Crime Commission files.

I am writing to follow up on the records review conducted by Review Board staff members in June in New Orleans. As you know, we identified a number of documents at the Records Management warehouse we would like to include in the JFK Assassination Records Collection at the National Archives. The nine boxes of records that you made available for us to review at your home also contain documents of interest to us for the same purpose. A description of the records we would like to have copied is enclosed as an attachment to our June 26 letter to Mr. Goyeneche.

Review Board staff will be returning to New Orleans the week of August 12, 1996, to copy the records we identified in June. We have made arrangements with Mr. Radosti and with Records Management to start the copying process at the warehouse on Monday morning, August 12. Please refer to the attached letter to Mr. Goyeneche for the details of how we will proceed. With respect to the boxes of MCC records in your home, Records Management has advised that it can transport these boxes from your home to its warehouse and return them to you when copying is complete. With your approval, we think that this would be an efficient way to complete our work with the MCC records.
