Thank you for your letter of April 3, 1995 regarding documents which you are seeking. Unfortunately, I cannot offer assistance with regard to this specific matter. The National Archives would be the best authority on assassination records which are already publicly available.

Under its legal mandate, the Board has begun its review of records related to the assassination which federal agencies, including the CIA, are seeking to postpone from public disclosure under relevant provisions in The President John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection Act of 1992. The Board has not yet made any decisions on the release of records which it has reviewed. Notice will be made of the records reviewed and publicly disclosed by the Board, as well as those records which the Board determines should have postponed release dates. I will add your name to our mailing

list to assure that you are kept apprised of the Board's work.
