Dear Mr. Tyler:

On behalf of the Assassination Records Review Board, I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for agreeing to make available your documentary "He Must Have Something" and outtakes of interviews as part of the President John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection, housed at the National Archives. These records will add significantly to the completeness of the Collection.

The Board also appreciates your agreeing to testify at our public hearing in New Orleans on Wednesday, June 28, 1995. The public hearing will be conducted in the third floor auditorium at the Old U.S. Mint Building, located at 400 Esplande Avenue, and will begin at 10:00 a.m. Because the Board will hear from you and other witnesses as one of the first items on the agenda, we ask that you arrive at 9:45 a.m., if possible. After introductory remarks by Mr. John R. Tunheim, Chair of the Review Board, the witnesses will be called.

The Board has set aside 10 to 15 minutes for the testimony of each witness. It would be helpful to the Board if during your testimony you briefly described your background, the production process and content of "He Must Have Something," and what is contained in the outtakes which did not make it into the documentary. Following your prepared remarks about the documentary, it would be helpful if you were prepared to respond to questions from the Board about where you think we should pursue other assassination records and which ones that are known to exist should be considered on a priority basis. In addition, the Board would like to extend to you the opportunity to submit a prepared written statement that would become part of the permanent record of the public hearing. If you choose to provide us with a written statement, it would be helpful for us to receive it by Friday, June 23, 1995.

Again, the members of the Review Board thank you for all of your cooperation. We look forward to having you testify at our public hearing on June 28th in New Orleans and arranging for the copying of the outtakes. Please do not hesitate to contact us if you have any comments or questions prior to the hearing. A fact sheet on the Review Board is enclosed for your additional information.
