On 5/12/64, ALFREDO ZAPATA was advised of the above information from Colonel MEDRANO and stated that he would attempt to locate the JOAQUIN RIVAS at the address shown.

ZAPATA advised that investigation in the section of San Salvador known as Colonia Militar disclosed a number of houses bearing #10. ZAPATA said that the address Colonia Militar 10 is not complete inasmuch as it lacks the name of the street. He stated that a detective conducted investigation at every house in the section of the city known as Colonia Militar and bearing the #10 without locating anyone who could furnish any information on JOQAUIN RIVAS GAMEZ.

that he could locate no identifiable information under the name of JOAQUIN RIVAS GAMEZ. He did have information, how to ever, that a JOAQUIN RIVAS, not further identified, had taken part in a Communist uprising of 1932 and had been a candidate for Mayor of San Salvador on the Communist Party ticket. This man reportedly had left El Salvador for Honduras in 1932.

on 5/13/64,

American Embassy, San Salvador, checked the name of JOAQUIN RIVAS GAMEZ through the General Embassy Indices without locating any identifiable information.

On 5/13/64, ALFREDO ZAPATA advised that he had personally ascertained that the branch post office located at North Second Avenue 1604, San Salvador, has only two employees. They confirmed information previously furnished to his detective that they merely receive mail and do not distribute from that address. They stated that they had never heard of JOAQUIN RIVAS GAMEZ. They were questioned as to what action they would take if a letter arrived at the branch post office addressed to him and both replied that they would forward it to the central post office in downtown San Salvador.

On 5/14/64, ALFREDO ZAPATA advised that Detective JOSE DAVID ZARCO PEREZ had conducted inquiries on North Second Avenue between East 9th and 11th Streets, which is in the section of the city known as Barrio San Miguelito but about nine blocks from the branch post office. This of
