Dear Mr. Chairman:

As you may recall on November 18, 1978, I voluntarily appeared to testify before the House Select Committee on Assassinations concerning certain remarks that I allegedly made to former Special Agent Arthur Murtaugh.

On January 5, 1979, portions of the subsequent testimeny of Mr. Charles Brennan, retired FBI Agent, were made known to me. During Mr. Brennan's testimony you stated that I had admitted under oath that I was racially prejudiced. I wish to bring to your attention that at no time during my testimony did I ever make any statement concerning racial prejudice toward Dr. King. I have carefully reviewed my testimony and at no time did the matter of race ever arise. I testified before you that my "personal prejudice" toward Dr. King was based on my conviction that his reported association with the Communist Party was the basis for his being a threat to national security.

As it was the purpose of the House Select Committee on Assassinations to seek the truth regarding the King assassination, I feel it is incumbent that this matter be clarified.

I completely refute your statement that I was racially prejudiced, as racial bigotry is personally repugnant to me. For these reasons I respectfully request that a copy of this communication be included as an addendum to the House Select Committee on Assassinations report.
