"On 23 May 1974 we asked for information that they might have on Sam GIANCANA. $C \leftarrow J$ it was believed that (C) they might have some information on GIANCANA. We never received a reply to this request. In-July told 1974, however, our contact us that the Government of Mexico (GOM) was expelling GIANCANA from the country, to the United States, within 24 hours "In meetings held with our contact on 23 August, 28 September, and 1 October 1974, we brought up the subject of GIANCANA, The contract said that the local immigration authorities had been seeking GIANCANA because he was in the country illegally. They finally located him in July, arrested him on the spot, and deported him the following day. The expulsion was not carried out on the basis of any specific information supplied by the US Embassy, nor were there any indications that he was engaged in any criminal activity here. Rather it was an internal GOM decision to expel an unwanted alien who was living illegally in Mexico It is noted that this blind memorandum does not appear to document the previous information from and is somewhat contradictory In further explanation 10/2/74 said he now believes had asked him merely to determine had any information on the subject since believed subject may have been designated as a target."
