7/30/63 that he had taken ARAGON also advised 'on' an examination in Washington, D.C. during the latter part of July, 1963, at the United States Department of State in order to obtain a job from this department as an interpreter and translator. ARAGON advised that he had just received word that he had passed the examination and the the State Department contemplated utilizing his services within the next few weeks. ARAGON also advised that this job as an interpreter and translator for the United States Department of State would entail his travelling with visitors from Latin America to various states and to various universities throughout the United States. ARAGON advised that he would receive a fixed daily amount plus \$20.00 a day expenses for each day he worked for the State Department in the capacity of a translator and interpreter.

ARAGON further stated on 7/30/63 that due to his past close association with the Bureau and his confidence and trust in the Bureau
