NOTE:

Subject, American soldier of fortune, has long been thorn in side of U. S. authorities primarily because of his anti-Castro endeavors. He has been ~~personally~~ investigated by several agencies. [CIA, on 11-19-63, advised it obtained contents of subject's briefcase which contained documents, correspondence and maps. One of the documents appears to be complete list of his contacts. In view of his continuing appearance on anti-Castro scene and his involvement with others throughout country, it is felt the names of his contacts should be checked through indices of interested offices as indicated above. Will Kerber, CIA, on 12-5-63 advised data in its 11-19-63 communication would be given to FAA, INS, Customs, and [redacted]. It is noted in this connection that among the items found in subject's briefcase were air navigational charts of various British possessions.]
