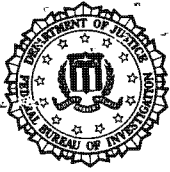

On June 15, 1963, MM T-1, another Government agency which conducts intelligence investigations, advised that on June 14, 1963, information was received that captioned organization is rumored to be planning a raid against the North coast of Cuba sometime between June 14 and 20, 1963. The target is reportedly at the boundry line of Matanzas and Havana Provinces, Cuba. (u)

(S) MM T-1 explained that the source of the information is [redacted] with intimate knowledge of maritime activities in Florida and this source received the information from a person who has contact with Cuban military and political groups in Miami. (u)

On June 15, 1963, Antonio Perez Quesada, 224 South-west 4th Avenue, Miami, advised that he is a Cuban fisherman, a member of Comandos L and has participated in raids against Cuba with this organization in the past. Perez stated he knew of no immediate plans for any such raid and doubted the organization was considering any such plans for the near future. (u)

MM T-2 and MM T-3, who have been active in Cuban revolutionary activities for the past five years, and who have furnished reliable information in the past, advised that they are in almost daily contact with the leaders of Comandos L and there are no indications that this organization has any military activity planned for the immediate future. (u)
