Reference is made to a communication from this Bureau dated July 5, 1973, captioned "Mitchell Livingston Werbell, III; Edwin Marger, Internal Security - Bahamas, Neutrality Matters - Bahamas," in which you were advised that in view of the investigations being conducted by the U. S. Customs Service (Customs) and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms (BATF), no investigation was being conducted by the FBI. Reference is also made to a memorandum dated July 19, 1974, at New York, New York, in the captioned matter, a copy of which has been made available to you. Copies of the July 19, 1974, memorandum have also been furnished to the Department of State, the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA), Customs and BATF.

Attached for your information is a copy of a CIA communication dated June 27, 1974, concerning the subject. For your information, CIA on August 6, 1974, authorized this Bureau to furnish a copy of its June 27, 1974, communication to the Department of Justice for its use. CIA advised it wished to make clear that the former Agency employees mentioned in paragraph two, John Patrick Muldoon and [redacted] provided their information.
