By memorandum classified SECRET dated 9-8-69, the hade available the following information which was recelved from a sensitive and usually "THIS INFORMATION IS FROM A reliable source. They stated: IT IS NOT TO BE DISSEMINATED IN WHOLE CONFIDENTIAL SOURCE. OR IN PART OUTSIDE YOUR OFFICE WITHOUT PRIOR APPROVAL OF THE ORIGINATING OFFICE IN MEXICO." A paraphrased version of the information follows:

In mid-August, 1969, ROLANDO A. ESPARZA, who used the address of Arcadio Hernandez, 3106 3/4 South Beverly Drive, Los Angeles, California, and also the address 623 1/2 Laveta Terr., Los Angeles, California, was in contact with the Cuban Consulate in Mexico City

The Subject claimed to have visited the Consulate during February or March, 1966. He also visited the Cuban Consulates in Veracruz, Veracruz, Mexico, where he met LUIS POSADA, Cuban Consul from Tampico, Tamaulipas, At that time he wanted to return to Cuba, but for reasons beyond his control he was unable to do so.

The Subject stated that now more than two years have passed and he realizes that his presence in the United States has no meaning. He therefore desires a visa to return to his beloved homeland, His Cuban passport, No. 40263, has expired and he wishes to have it genewed () (u) REC-123
