on 17 Jan 64 advising request by legal
attache for development of info concerning
Daniel Solis in Cozumel, Mexico -
concerning Solis knowledge of Rojas, Villanueva
re info about names of Cubans appearing in
an alleged notebook said to be in Solis'
possession, and an alleged official of
the American govt said to have been in
contact w/ LHO in Cozumel, named
Albert Lnu. Reference is made to
Albert (?) in letter written to RFK by Rojas

It appears that Legal attache in Mexico
has already arranged for Rojas inter-
view & developed info concerning
SOLIS, as indicated by the cable
Rojas letter attached

Subject: LHO 11111836

17 Dec Papach advises that FBI
was anticipating request from WC
for copies of FBI materials supporting
a complementary report already
submitted. He provided O'neil w/
report that shows some U.S. agency
was tapping telephones in Mexico.
Papach wanted to know whether
this info could be given to WC or

whether CIA should be notified
w/ regard, as well as whether it should
discuss it w/ WC. He discussed it
w/ Nelson, who advised WC should be

directed to prepare certain material
to be passed to the Comm'n -

He was quite sure it was not
the Agency's desire to make
available to the Comm'n at
least in this manner - was the
FBI-sensitive info which could
relate to Telephone Taps

after Papuck's & Angleton consultation
it was agreed w/ Papuck that
FBI should not pass to WC info from
CIA but should refer the WC
to the CIA for any add'l info

Called Papuck 9:00 a.m. ^{re} & told him ^{6:00 a.m.} ~~that~~
that FBI got communication in the
night from legal attache to the
effect that they were trying to get
[redacted] a better mood for the polygraph.
CIA had message to the same effect

On 5 Dec. Papuck was advised ¹¹¹¹¹⁸³⁷ that
CIA polygraph operator had arrived
in Mexico & the plan was to have
the legal attache Clark Anderson,
pick up [redacted] a Mexican ~~officer~~ officer
would accompany them to the inter-
view site & Anderson would be the
sole interpreter with Anderson in
between our polygraph operator & [redacted]

Papich gave Angleton all material he had that came from Soviet Embassy

Memo for the Record 3 Dec 63
Subj: O'LH

O'neal advised Papich that O'neal conferred w/ Helms, Angleton & Whitely & said was a matter to be decided by the Director (re [redacted] polygraph) O'neal informed Papich that it was an official request that we handle the further interview & polygraph. Papich said it was that he was getting considerable pressure on the question & that Hoover wanted a response as soon as possible.

memo for record 29 Nov 63

O'neal advised Papich that CIA was not turning [redacted] over to the Mexicans. No decision had been reached on this subject.

As Helms indicated Papich told that CIA hadn't turned [redacted] over to the Mexicans, certainly in the absence of a request on the FBI part. O'neal said that it was not FBI responsibility to determine what action should be taken & added that they need such a determination. Papich said he thought it would be O'neal's

Papert called back later & said that
[redacted] O'neal
denied this

Papert called back and said that
FBI had rendered ^{official} decision that
[redacted] returned over to Mex. ;
authorities & that Mexican interrogate
& polygraph [redacted]

Papert called back & asked what
CIA had decided in regard to
FBI request & O'neal advised
that CIA was complying w/ the
request. Cable went out ~~out~~
thereafter. In the interim Helms
was informed & he instructed that
the FBI request be carried out
immediately.
