At 4:30 p.m. on September 1, 1964, Mr. HARRY SHRIVER, News Department, Radio Station WFBR, Baltimore, Maryland, telephonically advised Assitant Special Agent in Charge GEORGE W. HALL of the Baltimore Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that his radio station had received a series of four telephone calls from a young male who would only identify himself as "HARRY" and would not give his location or other indication of his identity. The anonymous caller named HARRY also refused to call any law enforcement agency.

Mr. SHRIVER stated that HARRY alleged that the assassination of President KENNEDY involved a conspiracy by 20 persons, including one EARL JACKSON of Baltimore, not further identified, and a current United States Senator. HARRY had alleged that JACKSON fired the shot which killed President KENNEDY at the same time that shots were fired by LEE HARVEY OSWALD. In his most recent call to the radio station HARRY had identified the United States Senator as Senator DIRKSEN. He did not provide any further identification or details.

HARRY had stated to the radio station that he had tried this entire group himself, found them guilty, and will execute them. He first stated he would execute them within 23½ hours, and in his most recent call said he would execute them by 1:30 that night, which would have been 1:30 a.m., September 2, 1964.

Mr. SHRIVER advised HARRY did not sound intoxicated although he was obviously a mental case. Mr. SHRIVER stated he would advise the Baltimore Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in the event any additional calls are received from HARRY during which he further identifies himself or furnishes any additional allegations.

On the basis of information currently available, no prior information received by the Baltimore Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation could be identified with "HARRY", EARL JACKSON or the alleged conspiracy in which he was said to have been involved.

The following letter was received by SA GEORGE L.
LEWIS from Commander R. W. SMILEY, Puget Sound Naval Shipyard,

August 23, 1964, which states as follows:

"Dear Commander Smiley:

"Please destroy this letter just as soon as you have read it because it is probably extremely dangerous even to be writing it. As I told you when I was upset about my son's letter from Panama--you're the most influential person I know & that is why I am entrusting this confidence to you.

"We do not always know exactly how close another world is to us. I only know that sometimes I get 'designs' & perhaps messages from 'somewhere.' Something is impelling me to write you tonight that more investigation should be made of Pres. Kennedy's death. You see people from Wash D.C. often--there must be some way you can get word to the Pres' brother. Bobby Kennedy that he should do some careful but strenuous investigation. One of the weakenesses of people who are raised in the Kennedy's circumstances is that they have known too little of 'struggle' & feel that all persons are honest & straight forward & kindly like themselves not having enough knowledge of the motivation that will lead less fortunate people to lie & steal & kill for power & prestige. This too trusless attitude was death for Pres. Kennedy. I for one do not want to cast a vote in the next election for the forces that brought about his murder. I don't believe for a minute that Oswald did this thing on his own--or even that he was a communist tool--there are too many persons in our own country who could have had strong reasons for killing the President for certain stands he was taking.

"There must be some way for a good detective to find out who is sending money to Oswald's widow.

"Jack Ruby should be taken out of Texas to Washington as he has asked. If Mrs. Kennedy would talk

with him it would uncover something to prove . who has plotted the President's murder.

"Jack Ruby did not plan Oswald's murder. Something 'inspired' him & guided him that night.

It may have been the Presidents own spirit seeking to protect his wife & his country. If Jack Ruby can talk with Mrs. Kennedy truth will out.

"Here are just a few thoughts on persons who might have cause & power to plot the President's 'Scoop' Jackson waited hours in his rooms to be notified of his nomination as V.P. with when the Pres. Kennedy. It never came. He was married to a proud girl of a politically active family from down there--there could be a link here.

"Mrs. 'Lady Bird' Johnsen has a record of being very desirous of power & prestige. She could not have enjoyed being second to a younger more beautiful woman like Jacqueline Kennedy. Texas is her own territory where she could pull strings as no one one else would be able to.

"I am not politically minded at all--thats why its so silly for me to be writing this letter at all. But you must be aware of other personalities in the political scene who would fit the pattern of conspiracy. Remember your history -- time points that it was likely Sec. of State Stanton who planned Pres. Lincoln's murder. Really detection should be somewhat improved by now-if an investigation can just be made now before the trial is complely cold--Justice will be done.

"If I wrote to the Pres' brother or Mrs. Kennedy my letter would never even reach them. But you must be very astute & practical to be the commander you are. Use some of your know-how & get this message that has come to me to the dead President's family.

"Just burn this letter & don't try to talk to me about this. I have no facts--just a strong strong feeling from somewhere."



This matter was referred to the F.B.I. Laboratory, Washington, D.C. by the New York Office of the F.B.I. and the Laboratory examination reflected that the handwriting was not identified in the F.B.I. Anonymous Letter File, nor was it possible from the material available to suggest the particular mationality of the writer. However, certain similarities to German, Spanish and English writings were observed. The word "Blud" in paragraph 2 is close to the German spelling "Blut" (blood) and is pronounced "Blud" in Southern parts of Germany. The letter "T" appears in Spanish, German and English writings and the letter "x" in the word "Texas" resembled Russian or German handwriting.

To the Justice Department of the United States of America Washington, (D.C.)

"Gentlemen:

"I take the liberty of urging you to place yourselves in contact with the Office for the Protection of the Constitution of the German Federal Government, Office of the Foreign Ministry in Hannover. CONTRACTOR AND STREET

"On March 17, 1964, I submitted to the above office certain data and information which should prove very interesting also to you. They might have a direct bearing on the causes of the assassination of your President Kennedy.

"The indications I furnished are of great significance inasmuch as I believe to have dependable information to the effect that these 'guided actions' will become particularly important in the near future and will undoubtedly occur.

He said that while on a train from New York City on November 22, 1963, he met a thirty year old female, who identified herself as FLORENCE T. C. CABORE, of Westcort Company, 4 East 52nd Street, New York City, New York, home address 59 West 10th Street, New York City, Telephone Number GR 7-1955. She had been drinking and spoke disparagingly of the President. She told WHITTED that she had been told that the President would not get out of Texas alive. She said the Constitution has been violated since 1933, and that it was too bad the President was not killed a year ago.

Miss Florence T. C. Cabore advised that she met one Richard Whitted on November 22, 1963, during a train trip to Boston.

She stated that during conversation, Whitted told her that he was one of Teddy Kennedy's campaign managers when he ran for Senator in the State of Massachusetts.

Miss Cabore denied that she even made the statement that she was told that President Kennedy would not get out of Texas alive or that it was too bad he was not killed a year ago. She stated that she told Whitted that she had read an article about the way Adlai Stevenson had been treated during his wisit to Dallas, Texas, and commented that they might try to do the same to President Kennedy or even try to kill him.

Miss Cabore advised that she is very active in the John Birch Society in New York City.

My hotel was in St. Michel at the 'Hotel de la Gare in Rue de la Hoope. I went back there one day after an unsuccessful days' jobhunting. There was an American gentleman in the lobby with 25 pieces of luggage, which had been delivered to the wrong hotel, & he was looking around for a porter. I volunteered for the job, for which I was duly paid.

"During this, we got talking, & I summed him up immediately as some sort of an eccentric millionaire, & I must admit, I tried, successfully, to latch on to him. Over the next week, we became quite firm friends,

was a very interesting talker & told me a lot about himself. One night, we were sitting in an expensive restaurant (I forget the name) & he began telling me his life story. He explained that he was an engineer by trade, & a writer by instinct. He then get very worked up & said that he had been thrown into prison, & beaten up, & had had to flee the country. I will now quote as near as possible his exact words.

"The man's name was Thomas HARVEY. I believe he comes from Pennsylvania. I have more particulars at home in Brighton, including a folder of his work.

"I hope I'm not wasting your time, & making a fool of myself.

ERNEST H. GARRICK, 3460 Old Town Road, Bridgeport, Connecticut, employed as a cost accountant of the H. B. Ives Company of New Haven, Connecticut, furnished the following information:

GARRICK advised that as a stockholder in the Rutland Railway Corporation, Rutland, Vermont, he attended a stockholders meeting of that corporation at Rutland, Vermont, in April of 1961. He advised that among others present at that meeting were the following described individuals:

PRANK C. LA GRANGE, who he advised is the owner of La Grange & Company, 61 Broadway, New York City, and whom he further described as an investment broker, financier and a member of the Board of Directors of the New York Central Railroad; DANIEL A BRUNO, whom he described as a railroad securities analyst for the Wall Street Journal; L. JAMES GUMPERT whom he described as a retired former Vice President of Bon-Ami Corporation, presently Vice President of the B. T. Babbit Company and also a member of the Board of Directors of the Rutland Railway Corporation.

GARRICK advised that following this meeting of the Board of ... Directors of the Rutland Railway Corporation held in April: of 1961 he had lunch on the same date with the above three mentioned individuals at a small restaurant, name unrecalled, located across from the freight yard on a side street opposite a large parking lot which had formerly been the location of the railroad station in Rutland. GARRICK stated that during conversation at this luncheon LA GRANGE while in the midst of a tirade against labor unions and the Government, made a 🚈 statement "mark my words President Kennedy will not finish 🛸 his first term". CARRICK stated that he asked LA GRANGE to amplify his statement. Mr. JAMES A. MASH, Star Route, Provencal, Louisiana, furnished the following information:

MASH stated that he has known EMERSON VARNER PRICE, JR., since October of 1963. Around Christmas of 1963, while riding in PRICE's car, he saw on the seat an orange or yellow notebook (could not recall for sure the exact color) with the name LEE HARVEY OSVALD written on the cover, along with some other writing which appeared to be written by the same individual that wrote the name. Be was unable to recall the other writing. He asked PRICE about the name, and PRICE said something about picking up OSVALD hitchhiking on the road. WASH was unable to recall any further details of PRICE's explanation. He was also unable to recall whether he and PRICE had discussed the matter subsequently.

MASH stated that he last saw PRICE sometime in April, 1964, and PRICE at that time still had the notebook in the car. However, he was unable to recall the location of the notebook in the car.

MASH could furnish no further information in this matter.

Mrs. Al/THEA PATTILLO, 1721 Beverly Parkvay, Irving, Texas, advised that she is the aunt of EMERSON VARNER PRICE, JR.

Mrs. ALTHEA PATTILLO stated that her nephew, EMERSON VARNER PRICE, JR., is a "pathological liar". She stated that his chances of having given a ride in his car to LEE HARVEY OSWALD is "about one in a million". She stated that her nephew is such a liar that "he cannot even talk about the weather without lying about it".

Mrs. PATTILIO stated that the last time EMERSON VARNER PRICE, JR., was at her home was on Christmas Day, December 25, 1963, at which time her husband and she had ordered him to keep going and not to stop at their house. The last previous visit of his to their home in Irving, prior to the Christmas stop, was some three or four months previously.

She stated that her nephew was positively not at her residence in November, 1963, and specifically, on the day of the assassination of President KENNEDY.

Mrs. PATTILIO stated that she knew of no dental care her nephew had had in Dallas, Texas. She stated that she does not know any dentist by the name of "SPIEGAL", but stated that some nine to ten years ago, she had taken her nephew to a Dr. JACKSON H. SPEEGLE, a psychiatrist in Dallas, Texas, for mental treatment. She stated that Dr. SPEEGLE's offices are located at the Beverly Hills Clinic on West Moreland in Dallas, but he does not to her knowledge have any offices in the Mercantile Bank Building in Dallas.

Mrs. PATTILIO stated that EMERSON VARNER PRICE, JR., is a homosexual, who has been treated in the Louisiana State Asylum at Pinesville, Louisiana.

She stated that her husband and she had gotten so they could not believe one word he said. They have ordered him to stay away from their home in Irving, Texas, as he is a disgrace to them. Mrs. PATTILIO noted that it is too bad anyone would have to conduct any inquiry on the basis of any information furnished by her nephew as she is confident that any type of information furnished by him on any matter whatsoever would be completely fictitious.

EMERSON VARNER PRICE, JR., during the course of his interview on August 13, 1964, at Shreveport, Louisiana, stated that he had commented to the "rider" to whom he had given a ride to Dallas on Movember 20, 1963, and whom he believes was LEE HARVEY OSWALD, that the address written down by the "rider" as his home address in Irving, Texas, was an address near his aunt's residence at 1721 Beverly Parkway, Irving.

On September 14, 1964, Special Agent RICHARD J.

BURNETT drove the most direct route between the aunt's address
at 1721 Beverly Parkway, Irving, and the home of Mrs. RITH

PAINE, 2515 West Wifth Street. Irving, where LEE HARVEY OSWALD
resided while living in Irving, and noted that the total
distance between these two residences is approximately 4.6 miles.

It is further noted that the residence of Mrs. PAINE is located to the southwest of the aunt's home and away from Dallas, Texas.

The most common and direct route for someone to travel from the aunt's home to downtown Dallas would be to drive several blocks north and then turn east on Highway #183, an expressway, leading directly to downtown Dallas.

For one to travel to Dallas from the aunt's address via the neighborhood of the residence of Mrs. PAINE's would be completely out of the way and in the opposite direction from Dallas.

A review of the Dallas Telephone Directories for the years 1963 and 1964, as well as a review of the Dallas City Directories for the same years, does not disclose a dentist in the City of Dallas by the name of "SPIEGAL" or similar spelled surname.
