On December 20, 1963, NY T-1, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that during the latter part of December, 1963, he had obtained the following comments from Yuri Aleksandrovich Nikiforov: 5 18,10

[Nikiforov] has received a letter from his mother in the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR) concerning her comments about the assassination of former President John Fitzgerald Kennedy. She stated that she saw the funeral on television. Nikiforov stated that a story in Russian papers 5 relates how Jacquine Kennedy, the President's widow, commented to Deputy Premier Anastas T. Mikoyan that formerly there were two men in the world working for peace, namely, President Kennedy and Premier Nikita Khrushchev, and with the death of her husband, now there is only one.

Nikiforov talked about Lee Harvey Oswald, Kennedy's assassin, and he seemed to have read the United States newspapers extensively about Oswald. He mentioned the disclosure that there now appears to have been four bullets used in the shooting. Nikiforov gave the impression that he was genuinly grieved by 5 the assassination of President Kennedy and wished to extend condolence to American people over the death of their President.
