This hospital merged with the Hospital for Women and Children which had been incorporated by the legislature of N.J. on or about 10/8/1884, by agreement on 11/25/31 and was known as the St. Barnabas Hospital for Women and Children. The certificate of incorporation was amended on 12/11/56 changing the name to the St. Barnabas Medical Center.

In order that the New York Office will be in possession of all pertinent background information concerning this proposed loan, the Newark Office should furnish New York with copies of all pertinent communications submitted in this case. New York, upon receipt of these documents, should contact NY 3936-C to determine whether he has any information concerning this proposed Pension Fund loan and the possibility of kickbacks being made.
