first letters of the woman's last name were not legible on the copies supplied by the Diner's Club.

On February 20, 1961, Mr. MINGO advised that he had never before notices these charges incurred by other individuals which were included on the BARTONE bill and had never therefore asked subject about them.

MINGO said during all this time and up to the present that BARTONE has never maid anything on his indebtedness. Once $^{
m Q}$ early in 1960 at the Theatrical Grill on Short Vincent Street in Cleveland's tenderloin district, MINGO ran into ALEX "SHONDOR" BIRNS (FBI #22529, Cleveland Police Department #26456), a Cleveland racketeer who had grown up in the same neighborhood as MINGO in Cleveland. MINGO asked BIRNS about BARTONE, but MINGO denied knowing him. Later MINGO stated ARTHUR B. "MICKEY" MC BRIDE, former Cleveland rackets figure, now owner of the Yellow Cab Company, Cleveland. At this time MINGO asked MC BRIDE to have BIRNS help him collect his money from BARTONE. Later BIRNS saw MINGO, admitted knowing BARTONE and said that subject was now engaged with ALVIN NAIMAN in the operation of a stone quarry known as the Niagara Crushed Stone Company at Port Colborne, Ontario. BIRNS indicated that after they started moving stone in the summer of 1960, BARTONE would be in a position to pay. Early in the winter of 1960-1961 MINGO again saw BIRNS, who at that time told him that subject's stone business had not gone well and he had not been able to get up any money. About two weeks ago, MINGO called ALVIN NAIMAN at the Terminal Tower and at this time NAIMAN told him BARTONE was now operating out of the Sahara Motor Hotel, 3201 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland. said he had called there for BARTONE, but he was not in.

On January 6, 1961, CV-T-4 advised that there was no indication that subject had filed any income tax return since one filed by him on June 5, 1958, at Toledo, Ohio, for the year 1957.
