REVOLUTIONARY ACTION MOVEMENT (RAM)

Confidential Informant PH T-1, who has furnished reliable information in the past, on August 14, 1967, advised that MAXWELL CURTIS STANFORD, Field Secretary of RAM, came to Philadelphia in September, 1966, and immediately contacted individuals who had been active in the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) and who had been arrested during the summer of 1966 for the possession of dynamite. The Philadelphia, Pa., Police Department immediately initiated a program of surveillances and counteraction against this group, whose expressed intention and whose literature indicated a desire to cause a civil disturbance in the City of Philadelphia. MAXWELL STANFORD was particularly the object of police actions, and he has been arrested several times on charges ranging from painting signs on the sidewalks to conspiracy in the New York attempt to assassinate moderate civil rights leaders, and he is presently in jail locally on \$10,000 bail for conspiracy with others to incite to riot.

A characterization of RAM, which includes a characterization of MAXWELL CURTIS STANFORD, is attached.

In these arrests and searches of STANFORD's home, his personal notebooks, containing addresses and telephone numbers, were seized by the police and were available to Confidential Informant PH T-1. These notebooks, according to Confidential Informant PH T-1, contained the names of

persons known to be closely associated with STANFORD in RAM, but also contained the names and addresses of persons active in the civil rights or the general Negro fields of activities.

It is noted that RAM is an all-Negro organization, and the significance of this list of names is not known at this time to Confidential Informant PH T-1. The material has been indexed alphabetically by states. Attached alphabetically by states is this list. Also listed are the names of publications and organizations contained on this list.
