GUS ALEX, AKA. AR. DAILY SUMMARY.

CG 6502-C* ADVISED ALEX ON MARCH 2 LAST RECEIVED LETTER FROM SWISS CONSULATE, CHICAGO, ADVISING HE HAS BEEN BANNED FROM SWITZERLAND UNTIL 1975. ALEX RECEIVED LETTER WITH GREAT EVIDENCE OF ANGER AND CONCERN. AFTER SUZANNE FUEGER STATED LETTER WAS PROMPTED BY AMERICAN GOVERNMENT RATHER THAN THE SWISS GOVERNMENT, ALEX SAID "IT'S THE DOING OF THE FBI." FUEGER GREATLY SHOCKED BY IMPORTANCE OF LETTER AND QUESTIONED ALEX AS TO "WHAT HE WOULD DO ABOUT THE BANKS." IT IS BELIEVED THIS WOULD REFER TO THE SWISS BANK NOTED ALEX WAS OBSERVED RECENTLY BY SWISS POLICE DOING BUSINESS AT A SWISS BANK. CHICAGO GAVE SWISS CONSULATE BACKGROUND INFORMATION RE ALEX AND POINTED OUT THAT THOUGH ALEX USED AN EVERGREEN PARK, ILLINOIS, ADDRESS ON ALL FOREIGN DOCUMENTS, HE, IN FACT, HAS NEVER RESIDED IN THAT CHICAGO SUBURB.
